Session Overview: The rate of success in investigating and prosecuting sexual assault and domestic violence cases increases by recognizing the impact of trauma. To help the victims of crime, justice system professionals must recognize the basic scientific concepts concerning the neurobiology of trauma. This presentation will explain the impact of defense circuitry, explore trauma in ourselves, and dive into how trauma relates back to and is applied to supporting and interacting with victims of crime. Through this learning experience, attendees will discover pathways to procedural justice. The presentation starts by comparing our own personal trauma to the victims in our investigations, which helps spark "a-ha moments" for attendees.
